
The West Virginia 4-H Resume consists of a three-page resume that documents your 4-H career, three pages of pictures that offer photographic documentation of your work in 4-H, and a four-page story that allows you the opportunity to tell us more about yourself, your family, and your 4-H work.

- Resume Include in this section the types of projects you have taken in 4-H, what you have learned, the type of activities you have done in 4-H, the leadership you have taken in 4-H, community service projects you have been involved with and what you learned from them, and recognition you have received in 4-H and your community.
- <u>Pictures</u> Include three one-sided pages of pictures with your resume. These pictures should help tell the story of your involvement in 4-H.
- Story Describe yourself, your family, when you joined 4-H and why, successes and failures in your projects, how being in 4-H has affected you and your plans for the future, the programs in 4-H that you feel are strong and those that need to be improved.
- Your total document will be 10 pages and will be scored as follows: Resume 60 points, Pictures 20 points, and Story 20 points.

## **NATIONAL 4-H AWARDS**

This resume may be submitted to Morgantown by May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017 if you wish to be considered for National 4-H Congress or National 4-H Conference. A different coversheet will need to be completed and the scoring system will be different. Your total document will be scored as follows: Resume 30 points, Pictures 10 points, and Story 10 points. This will be combined with your interview (conducted at Older Members Conference in June), which will be worth 50 points, for a total of 100 points.
